

A message from the Chairman

"I was humbled to be re elected as Chair of Stratton St Margaret Parish Council at our first Full Council meeting of the electoral year in May 2024. I have served on the Parish Council for approximately ten years firstly as a co-opted member and then as an elected Councillor representing Upper Stratton where I have lived for forty years.

As Councillors we collectively agree on the strategic policies and capital projects that provide the services and infrastructure that our parishioners need and value. The hard work of translating our decisions into fruition is carried out by the paid employees of the Parish who are lead by the Clerk Amy Loxton. The commitment, hard work and dedication to the people of the Parish shown by our team in their daily work inspires us as Councillors to do the best we can.

As a Council we are very aware of the need to deliver our services in the most cost effective manner. In recent years we have reduced costs by improving the way we deliver services and streamlining the management structure.

Within the last year we have successfully introduced a community cafe, a community pantry, our very active youth service, and the brand new skate park! Plus a number of groups specifically targeted at our senior residents for example a walking group, knit and natter group and history group among others.

I am proud that all of these additional services for our residents have been achieved without any increase in the Precept (that part of your Council tax which goes to the Parish). We have frozen the precept for five years despite a background of rapidly increasing costs.

I look forward to another year of ever improving Parish services which will be delivered at a cost our residents regard as fair and good value for money.

PROPERTY

The property management committee have been busy the last couple of months developing and improving our services throughout the parish.

Did you know the Council maintain two defibs at Beechcroft library and Meadowcroft Pavilion? These have been used ten times in the 12 months. They are very import asset to the community and the Council will continue to maintain these weekly.

The Council also maintain three bleed kits throughout the Parish, these are located at Meadowcroft, Beechcroft library and Grange playing field. The emergency services can tell you the code to enter these units while on the phone to them. We hope you never need to use them but are there if you do.

Meadowcroft

Council installed a new flooring in Meadowcroft's Community hall. The old floor was originally tiled and put down around 1985. The new floor is hard wearing, easy to clean and will be enjoyed by many for years to come.

Now that Meadowcroft has had a three phase cable installed in February 2024, the property is having its distribution boards updated. This is due to happen over the summer months.

Beechcroft Library

New book end shelves have installed at Beechcroft library increasing the amount of books we can hold while tidying up the area.

Since the opening of Brew Book in March we seen an increase in foot flow at Beechcroft Library. The Council is planning on reinstating a second toilet in the lobby area. A new doorway will be knocked through to access a new toilet area soon.

We have installed new stands/locks at Beechcroft Library and the skate park.









Community Grant Aid

Interested in launching a community project, group, or club? Twice a year, in June and October, Stratton St Margaret Parish Council allocates grants to local charities, organizations, and activities benefiting residents. With an annual budget of £25,000, we aim to foster community growth. Details on grant applications are available on the Parish Council website.

Over the last year the following grants have been awarded:

Friends of Farrell Dance School were awarded £800 towards travel costs for dancers to compete in the World Irish Dancing Championships in Liege, Belgium in April'24. "It was a very successful event, as a result of all their hard work they came home with many medals and trophies including 2 world champions and a runner up."

Stratton Juniors FC were awarded £2,000 towards the refurbishment of toilet facilities at their clubhouse. The space is now updated and refreshed - "Loving the purple ceiling has gone!"

STEP (Swindon) were awarded £2,940 towards the Therapeutic Intervention programme - from A to C (Anxiety to Confidence). "With this incredibly generous grant we have purchased specialist distraction tools and sensory resources to support children and young people who are neurodiverse. This enables them to access groups, make friends and get much needed support with mentalhealth, well-being and associated behaviours."

Stratton Churchways Bowls Club were awarded £500 towards enhancing the outside space at the club. "We have purchased 3 benches and umbrellas. They were well used at the Stratton Festival and also for all our matches by both players and spectators."

In response, our dedicated grounds team has been working tirelessly to keep up with the increased demands for hedge cutting and mowing. We are approximately halfway through trimming the 8 miles of hedges, most of which are meticulously cut by hand. Despite the challenges posed by the rapid growth, all areas across the parish have already seen at least one grass cut this season, ensuring that our parks, pathways, and public spaces remain neat and welcoming.





In addition to maintaining the greenery, we are excited to announce the installation of a new hotel/bug house at the St. Philips Allotments on Beechcroft Road, Upper Stratton. This new addition provides a safe haven for our wonderful bees and other beneficial insects, supporting the local ecosystem and promoting biodiversity. These small yet significant efforts contribute to the health and beauty of our parish, ensuring that both residents and wildlife thrive in our shared green spaces.

The open spaces team remains committed to preserving and enhancing the natural beauty of our parish, working diligently to manage the effects of the fluctuating weather conditions. As we continue our efforts, we appreciate the community's patience and support. Together, we can ensure that our local environment remains a vibrant and enjoyable space for everyone.



Allotments

As the growing season unfolds, the local allotments are bustling with activity. We continue to rent vacant plots to eager gardeners and conduct site surveys to ensure our community garden flourishes. What have we been up to?







The Chairman's Charity

Recognising the need for regular road sweeping—a service currently lacking from the Borough Council—we are proud to introduce a dedicated road sweeping program for our community.

Starting in Autumn 2024, we will welcome the Scarab M25 Dual Sweep roadsweeper, affectionately nicknamed "Little Bow Sweep," to our inventory. This will enable us to maintain the cleanliness and safety of our residential roads. Our goal is to sweep all residential roads at least once per year during the winter period, ensuring our streets are free from debris and looking their best. Merton Pond Landscaping Project

We are delighted to announce that the landscaping of Merton Pond is now complete. The new pond, although smaller in footprint, has been designed to be deeper than the original to better manage runoff from Merton Field and maintain a consistent water level year-round. 



Can you fix damaged path surfaces and pot holes?

SSMPC are only responsible for keeping paths clear from debris, issues with path and road surfaces should be reported to SBC higways.

When can you trim down the hedges?

We have around 2 miles of hedges that are trimmed 1-3 times a year depending on priority and wokring around the bird nesting season.



How often do you mow the grass?

We mow our grass every 3 weeks starting end of March until November. Some priority areas such as children's play areas and cemeterys are done fortnightly.

How can I apply for a community grant?


